CCV PAC formed to support Traditional – Profamily values in Local Municipal, County and State Elections.

CCV PAC Purpose:

To support profamily candidates, regardless of political party affiliation, at the local municipal, county, and state levels of government who will uphold profamily principles in their respective offices. To support and lobby for local municipal, county and state legislative bills, commission actions, and executive orders that support the traditional family and to oppose legislative bills, commission actions and executive orders that oppose the traditional family. To encourage political action that protects men, women and children from the misinformation of sexual activists, and the harms of sexual addictions, sexual predators, sexually oriented businesses, materials harmful to minors, broadcast indecency, and the porn/sex industry in all of its forms, by promoting the principles of the Judeo/Christian ethic which is the foundation of our nation.

Who Are The Values Voters?

Profamily voters are also Prolife voters. The profamily constituency is a vast number of voters in both political parties. And they are also represented among Independent voters. There is a significant number of Prolife Catholics who are largely Democrats, as well as a

significant number of Profamily Evangelicals who are largely Republican. They include the NASCR Dads and Soccer Moms. They are students and retirees. They are both urban and suburban voters. They are African American and Hispanic.

They are as diverse as any recognizable group of voters on the political landscape. They are ticket splitting, values voters who are captive to no one but their own conscience.

Why CCV PAC?

The failure of politicians to act in accord with their stated promises such as local Democrat Steve Luecke's failure to protect the Adult Business Ordinance and subsequent failure to enforce it, as well as State Democrat Legislator Pat Bauer's failure to bring the Marriage Amendment to the House Floor for a vote just months after he had promised to do so are glaring examples of why profamily citizens must have a hand in the political process. Former Republican Senate Leader Garten's betrayal of the prolife legislation before him in his last term is another glaring example of why profamily values voters must take to the ballot box to remedy some policy issues. It isn't that these elected officials are bad per se, it is that they can facilitate policy that is so offensive to Hoosier families that values voters have no alternative than to express their frustration by organizing and letting officials hear from the slumbering giant commonly referred to as profamily voters.

While left wing activists promoting an aggressive liberal ACLU and radical homosexual agenda continue to try to bulldoze the Heartland States away from their traditional values and make hollow victories out of slipping horrible legislation through while many profamily voters just aren't engaged, CCV PAC is dedicated to changing that scenario and engaging profamily voters in primaries and general elections from day one.

After a bad law is passed or a good law is defeated, it is too late and then voters are often the victims of anti-faith persecutions and injustices. It often then takes years if not decades to remedy those situations. The gruesome partial birth abortion procedure is a tragic example of that. It took over 30 years and millions of innocent children's lives to rectify that one public policy error.

It is time that the profamily perspective was articulately represented at the front end of the process to help set the policy agenda. And when politicians lose their ability to be statesmen, forget their principles and stop listening, voters must correct the problem at the polls. When groups like the ACLU are over zealous and appear to be trying to suppress religious expression and religious principle from the public discourse, CCV PAC will be there as a voice of faith-informed reason to see that Hoosier values are protected in critical matters of public health and safety public policy. Safe communities are outcomes of profamily values at work in public policy. Vibrant economies are also outcomes of family friendly public policy.

The PAC will also protect the non profit status of the CCV's vital educational and victims assistance work in the State. When CCV leaders have spoken out on matters of concern in the past, some have actually threatened to attack the nonprofit status of our group. In the past we have been limited to 4% of our expenditures on lobbying activities. Now with the PAC there is no limit to our ability to lobby for good legislation or against bad legislation. Also in the past we have not, other than as individuals, been able to endorse candidates.

Now with CCV PAC we can directly endorse Candidates and participate in the election process with political ads and funding.

CCV PAC's First Endorsements

And there is no more important issue than selecting leaders who have the courage to stand for what they believe in. That is why we are pleased to announce CCV PAC's first endorsements. CCV PAC is endorsing in this primary election South Bend Democrat & Incumbent Councilman Tim Rouse for City Council at Large, and Republican Challenger Juan Manigault for Mayor of South Bend.

Politics can give rise to curious situations. Take for example the case of Councilman Rouse whose own party appears to be trying to edge him out of his incumbent position in the primary apparently because he would not go along with Mayor Luecke on the special rights for homosexuals legislation. In one local media, Rouse was branded as a 'yes man' for values voters. This has of course made him even more respected by profamily values voters in both parties. One thing is for certain he is not a 'yes man' for the Good 'Ol Boys and we think the Council President should have another term to serve.
