Pro Family Endorsements

The South Bend Mayor's Race

The last time there was a change of party in the South Bend Mayor's office was in 1963. A positive change is long overdue and this election has been characterized as the "Perfect Storm" in political terms.

The Perfect Storm . . .

- 1) Business owners and developers are unhappy with the anti-business environment and dysfunctional City Departments.
- 2) Taxpayers are frustrated and angry at oppressive property taxes and wasteful spending on consultants.
- 3) African-Americans are splitting their ticket and voting for challenger, Juan Manigault, because they are tired of empty promises and Luecke's liberal social agenda.
- 4) Hispanics are splitting their ticket and voting for Manigault, offended at the mistreatment of Fred Thon and Juan Hernandez.

□ **John Voorde (D)** has always seemed to be a "straight shooter" and stayed clear of Democratic Party controversies.



From a pro-family perspective, Manigault as Mayor, with a bi-partisan coalition of 4 votes would veto-proof key issues and protect voters from undue influence of destructive policies.

Manigault plus 5 votes from a bi-partisan majority equals the ability to enact and enforce the policies necessary to reclaim South Bend from its downward slide.

District 1

□ **Derek Dieter (D)** supports enforcing the law on adult business and voted against special rights for homosexuals. Derek is pro-life and supports responsible fiscal policy.

District 2

□ **Henry Davis (D)** hails from Greater St. John Missionary Baptist Church. The Church's late pastor, Rev. Billy Kirk, was an elder statesman of the minority community and served on the Board of CCV for many years. Henry is expected to bring pro-family values with him to the Council and should be a refreshing change to the far left views espoused by his predecessor.

District 3

□ **Tom LaFountain and Bill Soderberg** are very close in their pro-family rating. As neither has had the opportunity to vote on pro-family issues, we are making no endorsement in this case. We would expect that both will support

pro-family positions on the Council and we will work with the one who is elected.

District 4

□ **Gary King (R)** is a "hands down" favorite in this district. He is pro-family without reserve, and well-liked by those who know him. He is cautious about adding new ordinances that burden citizens, like the hang tag ordinance. He favors environmentally-friendly policies, fiscal restraint and will be a positive voice on the Council.

District 5

□ **Dave Varner (R)** has been consistently pro-family in his role on the Council. He supported passage of the Adult

Business Ordinance to place constitutionally-supported public health and safety restrictions on adult businesses. He also cast a thoughtful and decisive vote to lovingly oppose special rights for homosexuals. He has been the lone Republican on the Council and has a unique role that will continue to add value to the Council's deliberations.

District 6

□ **Oliver Davis (D)** replaces outgoing Democratic Councilman, Erv Kuspa, who was a pro-family friend on the Council. This is Andy Ujdack's old seat, reminding all of the dangers of pornography. This seat is expected to support enforcement on adult businesses and to support the traditional family by lovingly opposing special rights for homosexuals. As Mr. Davis is unopposed, and has not published positions on the key social issues, no endorsement is necessary. We expect to work closely with the new Councilman and wish him well.

At -Large Council Seats

We are endorsing 4 candidates for 3 At-Large Council Seats.

□ **Tim Rouse (D)** has been a welcome addition to the Council. He has been unswerving in support of pro-family issues. He supports enforcement of the adult business ordinance and he led the loving opposition to the Special Rights for Homosexuals Ordinance. He also favors the elimination of property taxes. Tim is a man of principle and does not leave his principles at the Council Chamber's door. This ex-Marine is willing to fight for what he believes in and for the values that profamily voters hold dear.

□ **Jim Frick (R)** has been an ally in the battle against adult businesses on the South Side and an advocate of business-minded redevelopment. He believes in enforcing the law and improving educational opportunity. His no-nonsense approach will help the Council move forward. When Jim

made the decision to run he literally moved into a small house in a rough area just off of South Michigan Street where he sleeps with a gun on his night stand, just so he could be compliant with residency rules. We are not aware of anyone who has gone to such great lengths to try to serve on the Council. He recently reported the loss of over 100 yard signs in the Northeast area of the City alone. In our opinion, it's time to send the Good Ol' Boys an eviction notice and put an end to South Bend election shenanigans..

□ **Karen White (D)** has served on the Council for many years. She has voted consistently in favor of pro-family positions. She voted for the adult business ordinance, favors its enforcement, and also lovingly opposed the attempts to promote the homosexual agenda, disguised in the nobility of the civil rights movement. She is a steady vote for pro-family values. We appreciate her strong and thoughtful style and look forward to working with her on the Council.

□ **Wayne Curry (R)** is a newcomer, but shows a lot of promise.. He is energetically profamily, and pro-business. He supports the enforcement of the adult business ordinance, and opposes the homosexual agenda. Wayne is committed to using fiscal restraint and would make a great partner in progress with Juan Manigault.






